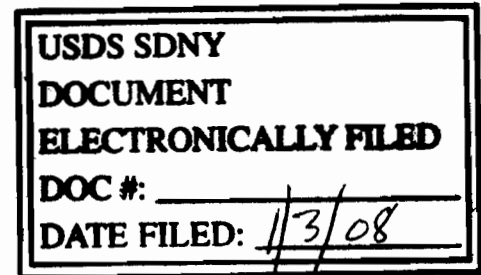

Third Amended Scheduling Order

It is hereby

ORDERED as follows:


1. No additional parties may be joined after November 16, 2007.
2. No amendments to the pleadings will be permitted after November 16, 2007.
3. The parties shall make required Rule 26(a)(2) disclosures with respect to
  - (a) expert witnesses on or before September 26, 2007
  - (b) rebuttal expert witnesses on or before November 26, 2007
4. All discovery, including ~~any~~ depositions of experts, shall be completed on or before ~~June 13, 2008.~~ *April 15, 2008.*
5. A joint pretrial order in the form prescribed in Judge Kaplan's individual rules shall be filed on or before ~~July 11, 2008.~~ *May 15, 2008*
6. No motion for summary judgment shall be served after the deadline fixed for submission of the pretrial order. The filing of a motion for summary

judgment does not relieve the parties of the obligation to file the pretrial order on time.

7. If any party claims a right to trial by jury, proposed voir dire questions and jury instructions shall be filed with the joint pretrial order.
8. Each party or group of parties aligned in interest shall submit not less than ten (10) days prior to trial (a) a trial brief setting forth a summary of its contentions and dealing with any legal and evidentiary problems anticipated at trial, and (b) any motions in limine.
9. This scheduling order may be altered or amended only on a showing of good cause not foreseeable at the date hereof. Counsel should not assume that extensions will be granted as a matter of routine.
